The Canadian Construction Association's National Awards Program recognizes the important contributions of projects, people, firms and associations that promote and enhance the Canadian construction industry. The awards program is open to all relevant organizations and individuals who meet the requirements of each award.

Each award is judged by an assigned CCA committee or council based on their areas of expertise. Where appropriate, outside consultation is utilized to assist in the judging process. If the judging committee feels that no suitable candidate has been nominated, the award will not be presented. All awards are presented at CCA's Annual Conference.



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Three Easy Steps to a Successful Completion of Your Submission

1. COMPLETE YOUR SUBMISSION:

Complete the nomination form on the last page of this document and submit the project narrative using the judging requirements specific to each award.

2. ASSEMBLE PHOTOGRAPHS:

If you don't have suitable photos, contact the architect, design professional, engineer and/or the owner, as they usually have photos of the project at various stages, including completion.

3. MEET THE DEADLINE:

NOMINATION CRITERIA

Nominations for awards must be no longer than five (5) pages (including nomination form and appendices), unless otherwise specified, and must include a narrative based on the individual award criteria.

All submission packages must include the following:

1. Completed nomination form
2. Project narrative based on judging criteria
3. Photographs – a maximum of 5 photographs of the nominated person/project will be accepted for each entry. Unless otherwise indicated, photographs will not be returned. Applicants must obtain the rights from their photographer to reprint the photographs without limitations.

CCA Environmental Achievement Award

Eligibility: CCA Member Firms and CCA Partner Associations

The CCA Environmental Achievement Award was created in 1991, and recognizes the leadership role that CCA member firms and associations have taken to promote and undertake exemplary environmental conduct within the Canadian construction industry.

In five pages or less, the nomination for the CCA Environmental Award will be judged on the following criteria:

- The submission must be for an engineering/architectural design, construction practice, technology, product and/or environmental management system or sustainable development plan.
- The environmental benefit of the submission, including quantifiable data, where possible, and substantiation through independent reporting.
- The innovative nature of the submission, including reasons why it was developed, such as laws or regulatory requirements.
- How the submission is relevant to the construction industry, and how it relates to the broader goals of sustainable development by the construction industry.
- The life cycle assessment of the submission.

Please note:

- *Submissions may include specific supplementary information, provided it has direct bearing on the submission. Supplementary information should be used to substantiate claims, provide proof of patent, independent evaluation, endorsement, independent performance data, and/or verified sales information. Promotional brochures or marketing information will not be accepted.*

The CCA Excellence in Innovation Award recognizes outstanding construction firms in Canada who have implemented innovative construction practices within the past two years. These practices must have been a “first-time” use or adoption for use in Canada, but may have been previously applied or used elsewhere.

The Hugh R. Montgomery Memorial Trophy commemorates the life and work of Hugh R. Montgomery, a past president of CCA who gave generously his time and experience for the general well-being of the industry.

In five pages or less, the nomination for the CCA Excellence in Innovation Award will be judged on the following criteria:

- The nature of the innovation and the relevant improvements to safety and/or health, productivity, predictability, profitability, environmental impact and/or values as a sustainable or long-term solution (repeatability).
- The sources for the innovation, including the entrepreneurial/financial risk taken by all parties involved in its implementation.

Please note:

- *The submission must not be in the design of permanent structures or projects.*
- *Submissions may be accompanied by up to three schematic drawings, outline only, and suitable for display, mounted or drawn upon stiff boards, which do not exceed 40 by 50 cm in size.*
- *If the innovation contains any feature that could be protected by patent rights, the submission must be accompanied by written evidence to show that the necessary steps have been taken to secure the requisite legal protection. The Canadian Construction Association cannot assume any responsibility for “prior disclosure” in advance of a patent application.*

The CCA National Safety Award was created in 2000 and is presented with the Gordon M. Vipond Memorial Trophy. The CCA National Safety Award recognizes CCA partner associations and member firms for demonstrating outstanding achievement and commitment to the pursuit of safety in the construction workplace. The award recognizes achievements in program development, staff training, industry contribution, as well as safe work record accomplishments.

The nomination for the CCA National Safety Award must contain the following information:

- Evidence safety record for most recent three-year period.
- Confirmation of credits for safety performance over previous three-year period.
- Most recent Workers Compensation Board annual report.
- Most recent Workers Compensation Board quarterly report (where available).
- Regional audit report (where available).
- Letters of recognition for safety performance.
- Evidence of year-over-year performance improvement.
- Evidence of past and future commitment to construction safety education and training.
- Evidence of participation in health and safety committees at the provincial/local levels.
- Frequency and format of job-site toolbox meetings.
- Letter indicating any outstanding cases before the courts.
- Evidence of company safety manual and safety policy.
- Acknowledgement of being fatality free for three years.
